Houston, We Have a Problem

- The need for the technological, operational and procedural improvements that NextGen will render is undeniable
- If the system is not replaced until 2018 (as is the current schedule) much of the system will be 80 years old
- However, prior efforts to galvanize the troops have not really produced the desired results



How Do I Get People To Understand That My Problem Is Everybody's Problem?

- A \$22 billion project needs a lot of godfathers
- The Rodney Dangerfield Syndrome
- The value of air travel is under-appreciated by the general public.
- Cargo movement gets even less respect



The Port Authority's Plan

- Engage the business community
- Organize a symposium with a business audience
- Educate the general public
- Establish the National Alliance to Advance NextGen to bring together the aviation, travel & tourism, civic, business, education, and labor industries to advocate on behalf of NextGen



It's Not Just a NY Problem

- The FAA uses statistics that the NY area is responsible for 75% of the delays in the country
- The caps placed on NY area airports result in the system's inability to accommodate the traveling public
 - By 2018 nearly 40 million passengers who want to fly into or out of the NY region will not be able to make that trip.
- Caps also jeopardize air service to small communities
- Congestion is not limited to the NY region



It's Not Just the Traveling Public's Problem

- Airports are economic drivers who benefit the people of a region, even those who never fly
- Aviation industry generates spill over jobs in the community such as leather repair stores, uniform manufacturers, packaging facilities and more
- Cargo, especially just in time packages, are critical for the business community
- Available air service and competition are drivers in business location decisions

Formation of the National Alliance to Advance NextGen

NAANG advocates:

- For the passage of the Federal Aviation Administration Reauthorization legislation that includes NextGen initiatives;
- For full funding for NextGen initiatives in Appropriation bills;
- That the FAA establish a timeline for delivering NextGen technologies and benefits;
- That the technologies to be compatible with our Canadian, European and Asian partners;
- That the FAA engage with all partners that are necessary to ensure the successful implementation of NextGen technologies and procedures; and
- That the FAA deploy NextGen technologies in the nation's most congested airspace first.
